A User's Guide to Our Services

Medical Car Service Tel 01435 515090

This service is available to provide transport to clients wishing to attend any kind of medical appointment – doctors, dentists, opticians, chiropodist, audiology, hospitals and clinics etc. throughout Sussex, Surrey, Kent and London.

Clients should use the telephone number above to ring and request transport. A recording machine will ask for details of your journey, together with your name, address and telephone number. Having left the information, your journey request will be entered onto our electronic calendar system, and one of our administrators will then ring you to confirm the details of your appointment, together with any special requirements you may have, such as mobility aids or a relative or friend who may accompany you. Our administrator will then allocate a driver and will confirm with you the name of that driver.

The drivers themselves will also make contact just before the day of your appointment to confirm your pick-up time. On the day, you will be charged 45p per mile plus a £1.50 admin fee for your journey.

We run a number of regular routes on different days of the week to the Union Church Lunch and Punnetts Town Country Lunches, together with shopping in Heathfield High Street and visits to the Day Centre at Horam. Our fully accessible buses are also available for groups to book to take them out on trips and outings. We also operate our own programme of half day trips throughout the year.

If you would like to book a place on one of our minibuses, or you have a place booked but are unable to travel, we ask that you ring and let us know in good time to save a wasted trip to pick you up, or to enable us to offer your seat to someone else. If you have any enquiries regarding our minibus service please ring the number above. This service is financed by the donations passengers give us for their journey each time they travel.

Safety First...

Your safety is one of our main concerns when you are travelling on our minibuses and our drivers and escorts are there to assist you, especially with fastening and unfastening seatbelts and getting on and off the bus.

If you require a walking aid such as a three wheeled walker or wheelchair, please let us know and bring it with you – we will always stow such items safely on the bus for you to use once you have arrived at your destination.

If you feel that using the step is becoming too difficult for you to manage, please remember that all of our buses are equipped with tail lifts which provide a secure way of entering and leaving the bus. Our drivers and helpers are always happy to lend a hand, so please just ask us.

Great news - we have now completed the legal agreements necessary to start with the first phase of our Men's Shed project!

A Men's Shed is a place where older men can meet, socialise, share skills and create together. There has been a lot of research which shows that there is an increased level of loneliness.

isolation and depression amongst older men who do not have the same network of friends and social engagement as their female counterparts.

A Men's Shed is a project that seeks to help alleviate some of these problems in a fun, safe and welcoming way. Each Men's Shed is unique and can offer different activities and hobbies depending on its location and members' needs.

The Heathfield and District Men's Shed will be situated just outside the centre of town, in an idyllic location, adjacent to The Little Tinker's nursery school. Set in some 57 acres of land the project will not only be able to offer the usual woodworking and craft opportunities, but also photography, painting, walking, gardening and the chance to take part in inter-generational projects with the young children attending the nursery school.

We are so lucky that Ellie and her team have been so generous and welcoming in their offer to us to site our Men's Shed in a location which has so much to offer.

We are so excited that the first phase of our building work is now underway, and will see the erection of a smaller, timber building which will serve as an office space, meeting room, 'clean' Shed and rest area where Shedders can enjoy a tea or coffee, a well-earned rest and the company of others.



Whilst this building is being constructed, the planning application process will begin for the bigger timber building which will house the necessary equipment for our Men's Shed.

We currently have 38 men who have registered an interest in becoming a member of this exciting project and who have been meeting monthly at the fire station, taking part in visits to other local Men's Sheds and having stalls at the local farmers market and Le Marché highlighting our aims and produce.

We are also very grateful for the support of individuals helping with this project whether it be storage of items in readiness, donating equipment, construction, materials and tools thus far. We intend to seek funding for a variety of further items in support of this project, in particular items of equipment for the Shed and office and our output will be on show at various markets in the town.


