

Important Information about our Trips Programme

Our programme of half day outings has proved to be a great success with many of our trips being oversubscribed.

We issue two programmes a year – spring/summer involving trips out in the afternoon, normally between 1.00-5.00pm and all of which involve a stop somewhere for passengers to buy a much-needed cup of tea (and a cake!)

Our Autumn/Winter trips are earlier in the day, normally starting at 10.30am and getting everyone home by 3.00pm before it gets dark. Again, there is always a stop for passengers to buy a drink and a light lunch.

Each time a new programme of trips is issued, we ask that clients ring to book places by using the normal minibus telephone number: 01435 866960. You will also notice that for our latest programme of trips we have put a date for when bookings will be open – this is to ensure that everyone has received the information before we start taking requests.

In the event that a trip becomes fully booked we will take names on a reserve list and offer places if anyone cancels, or, if there are enough names we will endeavour to put on an extra bus, sometimes on a different date, to ensure nobody is disappointed. We try to be fair and offer everyone the chance to go on our trips, so places are not allocated simply on a first come first served basis. We try to think of a good variety of places to visit, but if there is anywhere you feel would be a good place for us to go, we would welcome any suggestions.

Meanwhile, my thanks as ever go to all our wonderful drivers and minibus escorts who give up their time to ensure these trips can take place – I hope you all enjoy the outings as much as we do!

John Banks: Honorary President



It is with great sadness that I write to inform you of the passing of John Banks, who passed away aged 88 on May 23, 2019 after a long battle with cancer.

John was a key member of the operating team of Age Concern Heathfield & District from 1990 to 2015. He was minibus manager for many years and constantly drove on outings himself. He only

stopped driving in 2015, at the age of 84, because he became uninsurable. He often joked that he was older than most of his passengers.

John and his wife, Valerie, were instrumental in keeping Age Concern Heathfield & District alive by putting together a team to guide the charity through a difficult period. John was Chairman from 2010 to 2014 after which he became our Honorary, non-executive, President.

In his working life he was a partner in the Framfield building company of Press and Banks. He had a hand in the construction and alteration of many local homes and businesses, including the construction of the now demolished Buxted Chicken factory. He often commented, on journeys, about the buildings that he had worked on and highlighted the difficulties that they had to overcome during construction.

John will be remembered both for his unfailing sense of duty and his selflessness. He would readily 'drop tools' to help others. It is recorded that he once got up in the middle of the night to help his farming brother rescue sheep from flooding on the Romney Marsh!

Our heartfelt condolences go out to his wife, Valerie, his two sons, their wives, and three grandchildren.




Do you have a few hours to spare? Would you like to do something rewarding?
